

Assessment of Travel Impact on Iowa Counties




tourism benefits all 99 Iowa counties



travel-generated expenditures



Domestic travelers spent a total of \$8.23 billion in lowa during 2016, a 2.0% increase from 2015.



Five sectors increased significantly in 2016: public transportation (3.4%), lodging (4.5%), food service (4.3%), retail trade (4.6%), and entertainment and recreation (4.5%). Due mainly to lower gas prices, auto transportation declined by -1.7%.



travel-generated employment



Tourism supported jobs in several sectors: food service (26,000), entertainment and recreation (13,800), lodging (12,300), auto transportation (7,800), public transportation (5,300), general retail trade (3,600) and travel planning (800) for a total of 69,500 tourism-related jobs in lowa, an increase of 3.0%. Tourism comprised 4.4% of total state non-farm employment in 2016.

travel-generated payroll



Total payroll increased by 5.7% to nearly \$1.4 billion. On average, every dollar spent by domestic travelers produced 16.4 cents in payroll income for lowa residents.

travel-generated state tax receipts



Total tax revenue generated by domestic travel increased 7.6%, largely because of lower gas prices spurring more gallons of gas purchases. Iowa's gasoline tax rate is by gallon of gas.
